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5.).. Tulsi - The Holy Power Plant: by Gllgi Hauser

This Indian Basil is a miracle plant

Tulsi as an Elixir Tulsi as a Deity

Indian Basil - Ocimum sanctum - is an important symbol in the Hindu religious tradition.

The name 'Tulsi' connotes 'The incomparable one' and Hindus worship it both morning and evening. The presence of this plant symbolises the religious belief of a Hindu family and a household is considered incomplete without a Tulsi plant in the courtyard.

Some homes build a special structure for the plant which has images of deities on all four sides; some homes have up to a dozen Tulsi plants on their verandas like a miniature basil forest.

Tulsi inspires concentration, prayer, belief and passion as it opens the heart and mind bestowing the energy of love and devotion[1]. Tulsi is said to have been the plant that pleased Lord Vishnu; believers wear Tulsi leaves and beaded necklaces made from Tulsi stems around their necks.

Marked by a strong aroma and a stringent taste Tulsi is is a kind of 'Elixir of Life' as it promotes longevity. The plant's extract can be used to prevent and cure many illnesses and common ailments like colds, headaches, stomach disorders, inflammation, heart disease and various forms of poisoning and malaria — in fact up till modern drugs, Tulsi was the cure for malaria .

The essential oil extracted from Tulsi is used for medicinal purposes though recently because of the Ursolic acid 'discovered' it is used in the cosmetic industry as a 'miracle worker because of its anti-inflammatory, anti-tumour (skin cancer), and anti-microbial properties make it useful in cosmetic applications' [2] Pharmacological and Scientific testing has brought Tulsi oil to the West as a miracle drug — it is reported to have anti-tumour activity[3], anti-viral, anti-microbial and anti-inflammatory effectiveness. Applied externally the essential oil is beneficial for cuts, wounds, bites, stings and as a face wash for acne. Tulsi essential oil is said to be anti-spasmodic and can boost the Immune system.

For over 5000 years the Tulsi plant has been in used in Ayurveda medicine (Ayurveda texts[4]) — for rejuvenation and used as a tonic for vitalizing the mind/body/spirit to promote a long life — before the chemical constituents were 'discovered' for their therapeutic effectiveness!

Oscimum sanctum — Tulsi — has been classified as an Aadaptogen —anti-stress, chemopreventive and anti-inflammatory, fitting the criteria of Adaptogen — non-specific resistance to stress[5]. It reacts well to Asthmatic conditions, Diabetes and Arthritis. Indeed Tulsi is the Elixir of Life.

This small modest plant, is an annual or short term perennial bush type plant with greenish or whitish or purplish flowers. The leaves are a light green on the top and grey-green on the underside with a strong fresh clove like scent. It can grow up to 30 cm - 75 cm provided there is sufficient sunlight and it needs a lot of water. When I was in Jaipur last May my hostess watered her Tulsi plants each morning as I sipped my morning tea and watched the wild monkeys in the garden - this was at 05:30 as by 6am it was already too hot to be in the sun!

Lets look at some of the chemical constituents: The chief components are Eugenol, (here are the anti -inflammatory factors) Caryophylle and Triterpenoid ursolic acid.,Methylchavicol, (estragole) — considered hazardous by Tisserand and not to be used[6] — the seeds of sacred basil contain a fixed oil with 5 fatty acids, 70% linolenic and 50% linleic acid[7]

Tulsi — the sacred plant from Holy India

Sesame oil is good for high blood pressure:

Using sesame oil instead of other cooking oils helps reduce high blood pressure and lower the amount of medication required to control high blood pressure, said a study by researchers in India. The study looked at the effect of sesame oil on 328 people with hypertension who were taking 10 to 30 milligrams a day of the calcium channel blocker drug nifedipine, which lowers blood pressure by relaxing arterial membranes. They consumed an average of 35 grams of sesame oil a day for 60 days. The study found using sesame oil as their sole cooking oil lowered their blood pressure levels from 166 mm Hg systolic to 134 mm Hg and from 101 mm diastolic to 84.6 mm Hg.
